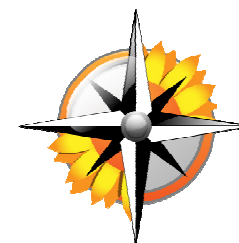

A STAR IS BORN: AUDITIONING FOR MUSICAL THEATRE

14TH JANUARY, AGES 9 - 12

Learning the technical skills to be a successful performer takes years of hard work and dedication but the best technical performers can fall in a heap during auditions. This workshop will delve into what auditioning is really like and provide practical tools designed to help you show yourself at your best. Techniques include how to break down and deliver monologues and songs. Song and performance choice and how to take direction. Although suited to children already participating in vocal, dance or drama classes, as an adjunct, Auditioning for Musical Theatre is a hands on practical workshop for anyone wishing to participate in the numerous Youth Theatre opportunities available in WA.

FOCAL POINT: INTERMEDIATE PHOTOGRAPHY TECHNIQUE

18TH JANUARY, AGES 9 - 12

What makes the difference between a good shot and an amazing Photograph? Luck? Expensive equipment? Yes these things all play a part, but no matter how inexpensive the camera, with a bit of knowledge you can turn happy snaps into "Wow, how did you get that?" The Focal Point workshop will look at framing for different subjects, lighting, Depth of Field and Colour vs Black and White as well as cropping and other techniques, using real life examples and hands on exercises. Participants must bring their own Camera and USB cord if using digital. Digital photos may be printed on the day. Participants must undertake to have film developed in their own time.

IT'S ALIVE: AN INTRODUCTION TO CLAYMATION

16TH JANUARY, AGES 6 - 9

Claymation has come a long way from the days of Gumby. Full length feature films are now created entirely from Claymation by the dedicated artists of Aardman Animation and Claymation has become an Oscar winning alternative to the CGI animation of Pixar and Disney. This hands on workshop will teach the essential skills of Claymation animation to your budding filmmakers so they too can express their passion in plasticine.

ZOOM, CLICK, FLASH: INTRODUCTION TO PHOTOGRAPHY

14TH JANUARY, AGES 6 - 9

Beyond simply pointing and clicking there is a lot that goes into a good photograph. Using a range of hands on exercises the Zoom, Click, Flash workshop will teach participants the basics of photography, including framing, colour, lighting and focal point. The specifics of taking good portraits will be focused on. Participants must bring their own Camera and USB cord if using digital. Digital photos may be printed on the day. Participants must undertake to have film developed in their own time.

STORYBOARDING AND SCRIPT WRITING FOR FILM

15TH JANUARY, AGES 9 - 12

Where do Blockbusters come from? How do we get from an idea on paper to a fully-fledged film with actors, action and drama? Storyboarding and Script Writing for Film will show you how! In this workshop you'll learn how to plan your film scene by scene, shot by shot and how to write a script so that the characters are believable and their dialogue drives the story.

PASS THE GRAVY: SUPERB SAUCES, SWEET TO SAVOURY

16TH JANUARY, AGES 9 - 12

Every great chef knows the secret to a truly magnificent dish is the sauce. With the right techniques any budding Cordon Bleu can delight and excite with extraordinary gastronomic creations. This workshop will impart practical techniques for creating a variety of sauces, reductions, deglazes and gravies, salad dressings, mayonnaise and custard from scratch. Your imagination provides the flavour.

BFF: NAVIGATING THE UPS AND DOWNS OF FRIENDSHIP

11TH JANUARY, AGES 9 - 12

What marks the difference between an acquaintance, a friend and a bosom buddy? How do you develop friendships that last a lifetime? The study of friendship is included in the fields of sociology, social psychology, anthropology, philosophy, so there is a lot to the study of friendship. This workshop will look into and demonstrate through active participation and role play the essential elements of great friendship and conflict resolution. Participants will learn what makes a friendship valuable through desiring the best for the other, developing sympathy and empathy, being honest, showing mutual understanding and compassion, enjoying mutual interests and each other's company, developing trust, reciprocity, mutuality and self expression.

CRAZY CAKES: AN INTRODUCTION TO CAKE DECORATING

17TH JANUARY, AGES 6 - 9

This workshop can best be described as Fun with a capital F. Combining the best of hands-on sweet messiness with the real-life skills of the professional cake decorator, participants will learn about the difference between cake recipes and what works best for different types of decoration, types of icing and recipes for making them, piping techniques and how to use easy to obtain items to decorate their own Crazy Cake.

INTRODUCTION TO WEBSITE DESIGN

15TH JANUARY, AGES 9 - 12

The secret to a great website is not about how much you spend or which great web design company you engage to do the job. The secret is in the thought process and planning that happens before any computer code is written.

It is planning that turns a free template into an amazing and inspiring website that will keep people coming back for more! In this workshop participants will create an idea for a group website and learn the step by step methods of getting exactly the website you want (whether or not you're doing the computing). Participants will learn website structure, how to create content that demands attention, graphic design elements and creating simple MP4 files for your webpage.

SUNWISE: SOLAR-POWERED TECHNOLOGY

16TH JANUARY, AGES 9 - 12

Solar technology is not just a current trend and people the world over are learning how to harness the power of the sun for efficient and cost effective energy. This workshop will examine the mechanics of solar technology and look at the current most common usage of solar technology as a method of household power production. Participants will get to plan their own household electricity system, the components required, system design, energy auditing and efficiency through solar site surveys. Each aspect is demonstrated with practical, hands on exploration and demonstration of the principals behind solar technology.

THE SCIENCE OF SCENT

17TH JANUARY, AGES 9 - 12

What precisely is it that makes something smell good or bad? This workshop is a hands-on exploration of scent - the chemistry behind odours, the way in which we perceive different smells and what goes on in the brain when we smell things good or bad. Participants will have the opportunity to design their own perfume to take home.

ON YOUR MARKS: POWERED MODEL VEHICLES

18TH JANUARY, AGES 6 - 9

Though most car models are static display items, individual model builders have sometimes powered their vehicles in various ways, including rubber bands, springs, inertia mechanisms, electric motors, internal combustion engines, air engines and steam engines. This fun-filled workshop will take participants through the various ways of making things move and the process of designing and making their own powered model vehicle. This workshop covers principals of aerodynamics, engineering, design and physics.

SCRATCH AND SNIFF SCIENCE

15TH JANUARY, AGES 6 - 9

Participants should be prepared to follow their noses in this wacky workshop on the science of smell - what makes things smell good or bad? How does our brain use smell to protect us? Why is smell the strongest sense of memory? Why is the smell of baking bread used to sell houses? Participants will have the opportunity to design their own perfume to take home.
